EMPLOYEE (voice over):

I'm single, and it

EMPLOYEE (sync.):

crosses my mind every time I walk out the door.

EMPLOYEE (sync.):

I've been married for 12 years, but now I'm separated, so I have to be careful about who I meet—or who I go out with.

NARRATOR (voice over):

[background sound of typewriter as graphics types across screen.]

Because we know how AIDS spreads, we also know how people can protect themselves from being exposed to AIDS.

WOFSY (sync.):

Safety is latex,

WOFSY (voice over):

condoms, barriers. The virus doesn't go through a condom.

NARRATOR (voice over):

The virus can't get through the rubber barrier so always use condoms when you're not sure if your partner has the AIDS virus.

Don't share needles. If you do share needles. If you do share needles, rinse them once in bleach and twice in water. Bleach kills the AIDS virus.
